

- The Fukushima Prefecture Tourism and Local Products Association offers a subsidy for group tours of up to ¥10,000 per person if certain conditions, such as staying for more than two nights in Fukushima and visiting more than five attractions, are met.

- Fascinating temples, inviting footbaths and a beautiful kimono museum in the neighborhood.












Scenic Areas Kaiseizan Park

- Kaiseizan Park underwent a complete renewal in 2024. During the renewal a large event space, running tracks, a café, and other shops were added, while existing infrastructure was improved to increase accessibility for visitors.
- The park is also home to Japan's oldest someiyoshino cherry tree, a large and colorful rose garden, an official and adorable Pokémon playground for children, numerous sport fields, a swimming pool, and a baseball stadium.



Scenic Areas Lake Inawashiro and Mt. Bandai

- Lake Inawashiro is a must-visit destination for nature lovers.
- The lake area turns into a winter wonderland when snow falls, attracting thousands of migrant birds.
- Enjoy numerous camping and glamping sites, as well as a variety of other outdoor activities.
- Winter sport enthusiasts will also enjoy the nearby ski resort.
- The many beaches around the lake offer a relaxing retreat and an unforgettable experience for all seasons.



Scenic Areas Nunobiki Plateau and Ryokusuien Flower Garden

- Nunobiki Plateau offers stunning views overlooking Lake Inawashiro.
- The giant sunflower fields bloom in August, creating a vibrant sea of yellow.
- The enormous wind turbines on the plateau contrast beautifully with the sunflowers and provide a unique photo opportunity.
- Ryoksuien Flower Garden is an enchanting yearround paradise for nature enthusiasts that is home to countless seasonal flowers.
- Visitors can also enjoy a relaxing meal amidst the natural beauty at the designated barbecue area.

Activities Glamping and camping

- Enjoy a variety of activities, including kayaking, cycling, and bonfires.

Activities Cycling

- "Inaichi," Koriyama's very own cycling route around Lake Inawashiro.
- This 58-kilometer-long route offers numerous resting places and sightseeing spots, ideal for leisurely rides and capturing beautiful photos.
- Cycling enthusiasts can participate in the annual "Tour de Inawashiro" event held in September.
- In winter, tourists can also cycle around the lake on fat bikes.

- A manju-making workshop, where you'll craft these traditional Japanese sweets under the guidance of professionals.
- A pottery workshop that offers a hands-on experience. Perfect for tourists interested in Japanese ceramics.
- A miso-making workshop where you'll dive into the world of Japanese cuisine and learn more about this essential ingredient.
- A tatami coaster-making workshop where you can get a feel for the qualities of this typical Japanese material.

- The perfect place to buy a unique souvenir and take home a piece of Japan's artistic tradition and craftsmanship.




Activities Living in rural Japan experience

Activities Sake Brewery Niida Honke Tour

- Visitors can learn about the traditional brewing techniques and enjoy their monthly customer appreciation and thank you sales campaign.
- The brewery's logo features an adorable frog that symbolizes their care for nature.



Activities Asaka Distillery Tour

- The Asaka Distillery is the oldest whiskey distillery in Tohoku. Its exceptional Yamazakura Blended Malt Japanese Whiskey Asaka Sherry Wood Reserve won the world's highest award in the Blender Malt Whiskey category at the World Whiskey Awards in 2022.
- Visitors can create their own, unique Japanese whiskey blend at the distillery, offering a personalized and memorable experience.
- A must-visit for whiskey lovers and anyone interested in Japan's rich distilling traditions.

Activities Ouse Winery Tour

- The Ouse Winery was established in 2015, with the aim of promoting the delicious peaches, pears, and apples of Fukushima.
- The wine is crafted from grapes cultivated by thirteen dedicated farmers in the city. This collaborative approach has resulted in wines that have received multiple national awards in recent years.
- A must-visit for wine enthusiasts that wish to learn more about the local viticulture.

Shrines, tumuli, and festivals

Culture and History Kaiseizan Daijingu Shrine and Takayashiki Inari Shrine

- The historic Kaiseizan Daijingu Shrine was build in 1876 and is Koriyama's most important shrine.
- Immerse yourself in tradition by renting a shrine maiden outfit for a unique photo opportunity.
- Experience the spiritual side of Japan by praying at the shrine and drawing a fortune slip, and take home a decorated *ema* as a souvenir.
- Tourists can also visit the Takayashiki Inari Shrine, a stunning photo location with around a hundred torii gates. It also features a sacred stone that is known as a power spot. Combining your trip to the shrine with a visit to Deko Yashiki for an unforgettable cultural experience.



Culture and History Tumuli at Oyasuba Historical Park

- The distinctive key-hole shaped mounds at Oyasuba Historical Park date back to the Kofun period (ca. 3rd century–7th century) and provide a fascinating glimpse into early Japanese history.
- Enjoy a magatama-making workshop, where you can make your very own version of these comma-shaped bead accessories, and take home a truly unique souvenir while learning about Japan's rich cultural heritage.



Culture and History Festivals

- The Uneme Festival is a festival where local groups and organizations dance to a traditional song in beautiful outfits.
- This lively celebration showcases the community's spirit and cultural heritage, offering a unique and colorful spectacle for tourists to enjoy.
- Koriyama's Beer Festival is annual 3-day event that is held at the end of July. The station area transforms into a massive beer garden where you can drink beers with Japanese locals.
- The Asakakunitsuko Shrine Festival is a vibrant festival that began in 1765. The festival features a colorful parade where portable Shinto shrines are carried through the streets. It is held in September.
