

- Starting from JR Yawatahama Station, the tour will visit the coastal villages of Ikata Town and head for the Kamegaike hot spring resort.
- 15 km, 4-5 hour walk along the coastline and other areas with few ups and downs.
- After the walk, you can enjoy the Onsen spa, which has just opened in 2024.

The "Sadamisaki Peninsula" is famous as the longest and slenderest peninsula in Japan.

The "Ehime Sadamisaki Trail" is a 50-km trail that traverses the peninsula on foot, connecting scattered villages and experiencing nature and culture.

The route has been created in collaboration with the local community, recognizing the value of the local nature and culture, and the landscape and activities as they are.

"The SADAMISAKI TRAIL" is a specialized trail that traverses
Japan's longest and slenderest peninsula, Sadamisaki Peninsula,
on foot, connecting villages scattered along its 50 km length,
allowing visitors to experience nature and culture. The trail consists of five sections.
The entire trail will take 4 nights and 5 days, starting from the Ikata Town Hall to the
lighthouse at the westernmost point of the trail. (There are endless ways to enjoy the trail,
such as walking it in sections or partially cycling it.)

The Sadamisaki Trail has minimal development and maintenance in order to achieve and operate the SDGs concept and sustainable trail management in the region.

Our priority is to serve travelers by capturing the value of the region's nature, culture, and unspoiled scenery and activities. The sense of accomplishment of running the SADAMISAKI TRAIL, experiencing one of the best landscapes in Japan, the local life and culture, and contact with the village and community, are all part of the SADAMISAKI TRAIL.

The course of this tour is the first section, a walking route along the coastline from in front of the Ikata Town Hall to Kamegaike Hot Springs Resort, which opened in February 2024.

The tour will not only take you along the seaside with its spectacular scenery,

but also through villages scattered throughout the area, providing a fascinating glimpse into the lifestyle of the local people.

The route is relatively easy for those who are not accustomed to hiking trails, as it follows roads used in daily life rather than mountain paths.

Recommended itinerary

- · Meet your guide at JR Yawatahama Station and take a private car to Ikata Town Hall.
- · Start the trail near the town hall.
- · Enjoy walking along the blue coastline, fishermen's harbors, orange farms and villages.
- · Arrive at the Kamegaike spa resort. Not only can you enjoy the hot springs,

but also shopping and restaurants are available.

(overnight stay at Kamegaike Onsen or in Yawatahama City is also available).
