**WHEN TO GO HIKING**  
Spring (April to June) and Autumn (late September to mid-November) are the best times for hiking, on account of mild temperatures

**HIKING ESSENTIALS:**  
1. Water: A freshwater spring you see on the map may run dry during the summertime.  
2. Sunscreen and a hat: The sun can be very strong in Greece.  
3. Maps, apps and a compass: some paths are clearly signposted while others may be unmarked.  
4. Cellphone: Dial 112 to reach the local Civil Protection Office  
5. A first aid kit

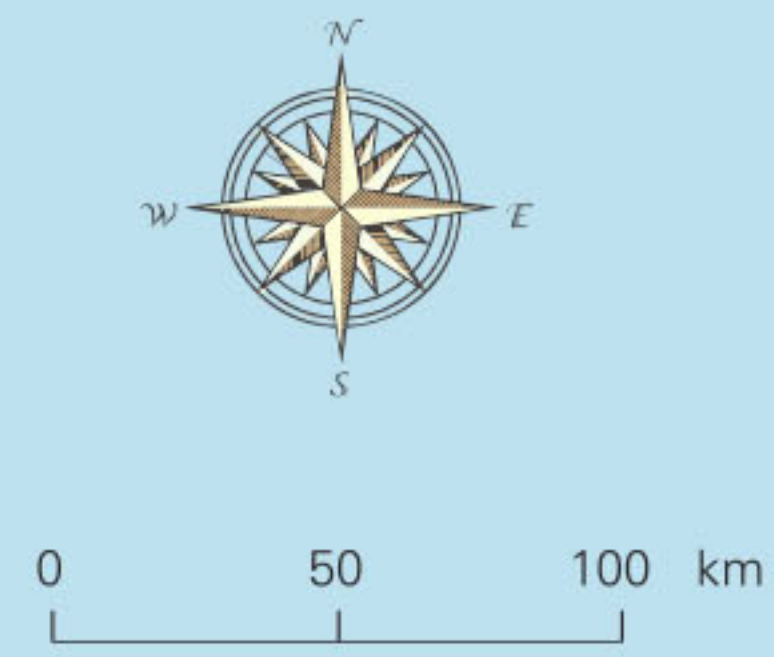

# SCUBA DIVING

## KAYAKING & RAFTING



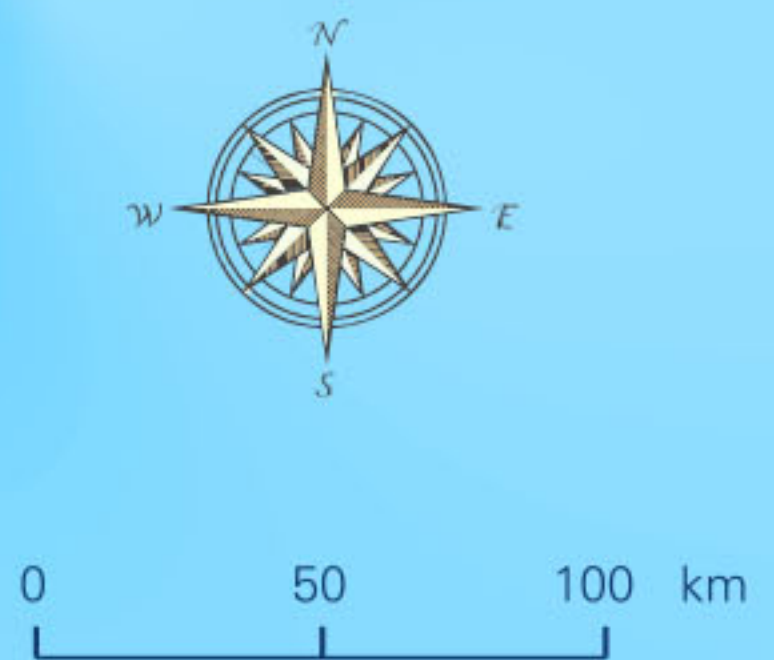
- **Diving**
  -  Dive site
  -  Alonnisos Underwater Museum, Peristera island
  -  Shipwreck or sunken aircraft
  -  Underwater biodiversity trails
- **Kayaking**
  -  River suitable for kayaking
- **Rafting**
  -  River suitable for rafting

It is forbidden by Law to dive in areas:

- Used as shipping lanes or anchorages
- Reserved for use by the Armed Forces
- Where hired motorboats sail and within 100m from their mooring
- Designated as Protected Marine Areas
- Where there are underwater cables and structures installed by utility companies
- Where access is prohibited by Coastguard authorities

Divers are expected to:

- Inform the Coastguard in case they locate archeological objects or shipwrecks or items that should be reported to the Police
- Have a diving flag displayed on the dive boat
- Have a diving buoy displayed in case they venture more than 50m away from the boat or if they dive without a dive boat.
