

Huge Lineup of Local Foods and Specialties Available along the Linimo Line

Featuring everything from familiar Nagoya specialties like miso-stewed udon and chicken wings to the must-try local flavors in Seto, Toyota, Nishin, Nagakute, and other areas along the Linimo Line! You can also use this list for souvenir ideas.

Nagoya City
Hittsuabushi (Eel bowl)
Baked eel that's been dipped in a sweet soy-based sauce is sliced into long strips and served on top of rice in a wooden bowl. You can savor this rice dish in three ways!

Miso-riced Miso-stewed Udon
Fresh udon noodles are baked directly in miso soup and topped with an earthenware pot. The noodles' unique texture and the rich flavor from the soybean miso make for a delicious dish.

Tebasaki (Chicken wings)
Decadent chicken wings are coated in a moist and spicy sauce, then dusted with spices and sesame seeds for a flavor that packs a punch. They're perfect with a beer!

Taiwan Ramen
A superlative version of Taiwanese chicken wings is added to the chicken broth base, and the dish is topped with gyoza (dumplings) and beef and garlic chives.

Seto City
Seto Yakisoba
A local yakisoba dish flavored with a soybean-based pork broth. It's made with steamed beefsteak, and the added pork and chashu are the stars of the show.

Seto Ware
This pottery is made in and around Seto City, an area rich in handicrafts. You can find a range of ceramic and porcelain dishes with various patterns and designs.

Toyota City
Kikuchi (Local sake)
This refined sake made and sold by Ueno Sake Brewery won the Gold Prize in the Annual Japan Sake Awards. It's characterized by its soft rice flavor and great aftertaste.

Tenka Mochi
This is a specialty Tenka Dango, a kind of mochi made from rice. It's a delicious treat to enjoy with a cup of tea. The Tenka Dango is made with rice and is known for its soft texture.

Wild Boar Croquettes
These croquettes are the pride of Hatsumi, a restaurant known for its wild game dishes. The wild boar meat is perfectly cooked with the potato inside, creating a sweet, salty taste.

Japan's first maglev train!

The Linimo is Japan's first maglev train, meaning that it runs on a magnetic levitation system. Unlike trains that run via the usual rails and wheels, magnetic force keeps the Linimo running as it levitates about 8 mm above the track. This reduces noise and vibrations, making for a smooth ride. The train has minimal impact on the surrounding environment, and there are very few parts that wear out, which reduces the labor time and expenses needed to maintain the train cars and rails.

What kind of train is the Linimo?

There's no driver?! The view from the big windows is amazing!

The Linimo runs unmanned and automatically thanks to ATO (Automatic Train Operation). Having no driver means that if you sit in the train's front seat, you can take in the view of the track ahead as-is from the expansive glass window in the front. The train runs quietly and needs no sound barriers, so the windows were made large. This makes the interior feel bright and open. Most of the stations are also elevated, allowing for excellent views.

Superb acceleration, even on steep slopes and sharp turns

Quick acceleration is another advantage of the maglev system. The speed increases smoothly with no friction to cause resistance. It handles steep slopes and sharp turns well, too, making for a smooth ride even in uneven, winding areas. The train also wraps around the rails underneath it, so you don't have to worry about accidents like derailing or overturning.
