visit European Capital of Culture 2029



In 2029, Lublin will proudly bear the title of European Capital of Culture and will contentedly implement the programme of celebrations prepared with its inhabitants. The city has several years of intensive preparation and work ahead of it to translate the ideas in the winning competition application.

Lublin is a city with enormous cultural potential, and it is becoming increasingly recognisable in Poland and Europe. For years, it has been building an artistic community based on its resources and experience, which provides a basis for local, national, and international cooperation.

Winning the title of European Capital of Culture 2029 means not only a host of exceptional initiatives, projects and cultural events. It also means the development of tourism-related sectors and the promotion of the city on an unprecedented scale. All this will translate into many positive changes that will contribute to developing both culture and tourism, as well as many other areas of the city's life.

Winning the ECC competition is a chance to confront the cultural and civilisational problems of cities, allowing them to increase the well-being of their inhabitants. The European Capital of Culture is also a natural continuation of the title born by Lublin in 2023, the European Youth Capital, which programme has allowed young people to actively co-create the city's culture and engage socially.

The idea of Lublin's application for the title of European Capital of Culture 2029 is contained in the slogan **RE:UNION**. There is a reference to the Union of Lublin, concluded in 1569. However, the historical perspective is only a starting point for a revision of the concept of union both in reflecting on the present and designing the future.

The slogan RE:UNION encourages questions about a new communitarianism while maintaining an awareness of separateness and uniqueness. It points to the network of connections between Eastern European countries, the links between art, science, sport, the creative sector and business. It hopes to strengthen them, exchange experiences, flow knowledge and reflections to ensure they work together for real, sustainable urban development.

The idea of RE:UNION cuts across three areas:

- **Community** - tells the story of the search for European unity, but also of the rebirth of communities of inhabitants, respecting their diversity.
- **Habitat** - is a space for discussing the relationship between humans and nature, well-being, human relationships, and the opportunities and threats of virtual worlds.
- **Borders** - is an exploration of artistic, mental and geopolitical boundaries. Above all, however, they speak of the courage to cross them and the search for freedom.





Where is Lublin?

Lublin is one of the largest cities in eastern Poland. The road S12 & S17 to Warsaw, the capital of Poland, takes just a little more than 90 minutes (about 170 km). The road to Cracow - S19 & A4 - takes three hours. Poland is a member of the European Union and Schengen Area.

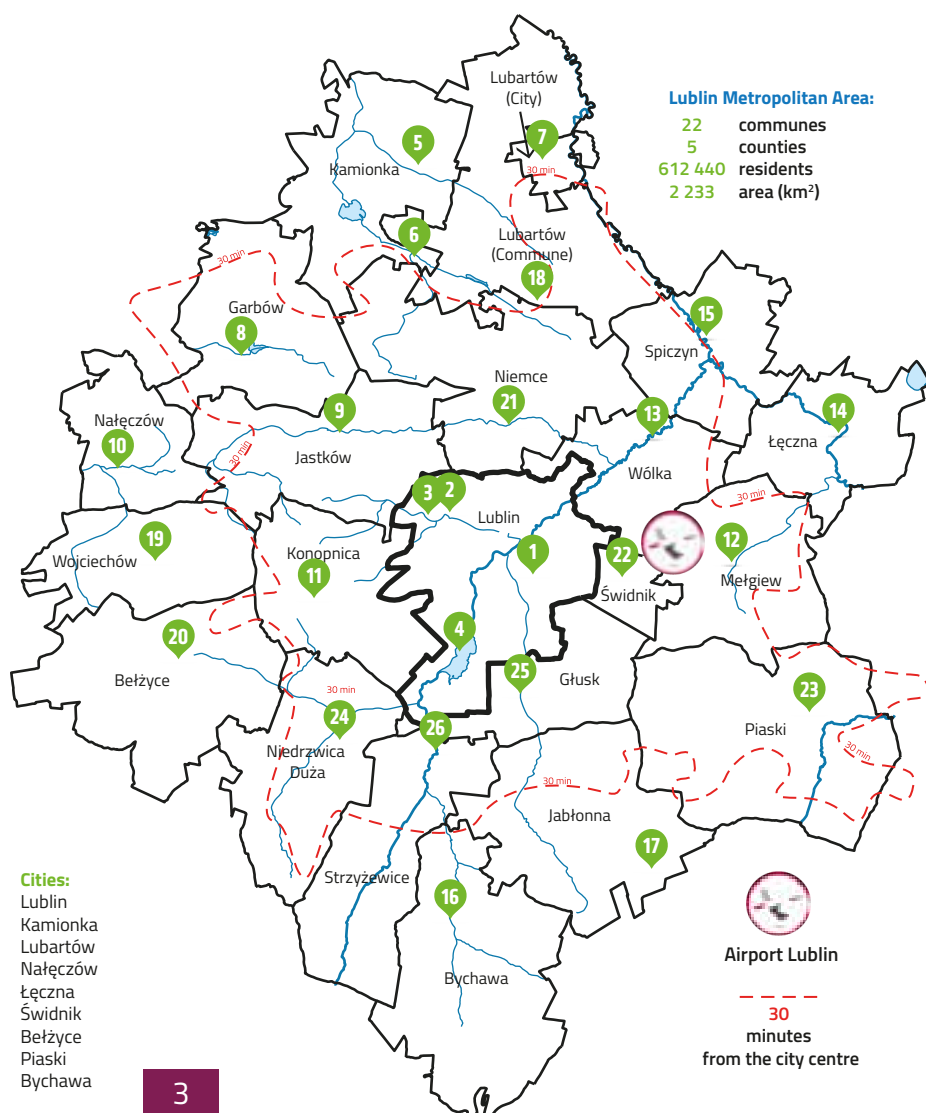

Over 700 years of history guarantee that memories of Lublin will last a lifetime. Here, we present the main attractions from the Castle through the Old Town to the City Centre and beyond. Just a few steps from the castle hill, vivid townhouses and secret side streets await you. In the summertime, City Centre brims with festivals. In colder months, all forms of art in museums and galleries are a must-see. Almost every Lublin monument is adjacent to a restaurant or café. There is also the Tourist Inspiration Centre at Jezuicka st. 1/3 (near Krakowska Gate, at the entrance to the Old Town), where we await you every day. Is it better to go to the gothic Chapel or the Street Art Gallery first? And how to get to the Underground Route? And where one can try pot-brewed coffee?

Jewish Lublin

Jews wrote one of the most beautiful pages of Lublin's history. The community constituted a significant part of its citizens from the Middle Ages. The famous Hasidic rabbi **Jaakov Icchak Horowitz** lived, taught and was buried here. His grave is still a place of pilgrimage for Hasidim.

The beginning of the 20th century was a period of intense development of the Jewish community in Lublin, which constituted one-third of the city's population. At that time, the Talmudic school, **Yesziva Chachmei Lublin**, was established. The following years brought tragic events. During World War II, the Nazis occupants transformed the Jewish district into a ghetto. Its inhabitants became victims of the Holocaust.

Green Lublin

City parks are significant places for walking and relaxing. There are a lot of them in Lublin! In the city centre, there is the **Ogród Saski** (Saxon Garden), a green enclave with many old trees - monuments of nature. Visit the **Park Ludowy** (People's Park) or parks in dry valleys with walking and cycling paths. You can also rest in the **Lublin Open-Air Village Museum** between old huts, wooden churches and windmills. If you want to find out hundreds of the most beautiful plants from the region and the whole world you should visit the **UMCS Botanical Garden**.



Lublin Castle

Its origins date back to the 12th century. Located between Krakow and Vilnius, it was vital to the Jagiellon dynasty. Here, in 1569, the Polish-Lithuanian Union that formed the Commonwealth was proclaimed. In the 17th century, only the Chapel and the Donjon survived the wars. Later, under Russian rule, the place became a prison. Today it is the seat of the National Museum. The "Union of Lublin" by Jan Matejko and the table with the Devil's Paw are just two of its treasures.

Holy Trinity Chapel

Here West meets East quite literally. The gothic chapel, erected by king Casimir the Great, was filled with Rutheno-Byzantine polychromies by order of King Władysław Jagiełło. Both the political idea of his dynasty (uniting two worlds) and the cosmology of the 15th century are visible in it. Angels of the Chapel slept for centuries under layers of plaster. Today they are our pride, and European Heritage Label confirms that.

Old Town

It is the heart of Lublin and the stage for its festivals. Despite many wars, most of the Old Town's buildings have survived. The Krakowska and Grodzka Gates, the Fortune Cellar, St. Stanislaus Basilica and the Tribunal are its gems. Lesser-known streets such as Jezuicka or Rybna also invite you for charming strolls.

While wandering through the Old Town, go to Po Farze Square to see the panoramic view of Lublin Castle and rebuild the St. Michael Parish Church with the *Turystyczny Lublin* App.

St. Stanislaus Basilica and the Monastery of the Dominican Friars

The Dominicans have written themselves on many pages of Lublin's history. One legend says that during the great fire, after the procession with the relics of the Holy Cross, the sky sent rain. That is the theme of the painting "The Fire of Lublin in 1719", which you can find in one of the 11 beautifully decorated chapels of the Basilica.

The Grodzka Gate-NN Theatre Centre

One of the best places to look for the city's past, The Grodzka Gate used to be a passageway between Christian and Jewish towns in Lublin. Today it houses an exhibition called "Lublin. Memory of the Place" dedicated to the history of the Jews of Lublin. Through hundreds of pictures, sounds of the Jewish streets, a model of prewar Lublin, and testimonies of former and current inhabitants of Lublin, the exhibition tells the story of a nonexistent town and its destruction.

Lithuanian Square

The Main Lublin Square hosts several monuments. Most impressive is the one of Marshal Jozef Pilsudski. There are also monuments of the Constitution of May 3 and the Union of Lublin. The Czechowicz memorial marks the spot where the poet was killed by a Luftwaffe bomb in 1939. The poplar tree that grows on the Square is a symbol of resistance to Russian rule. Palaces of the magnates adorn Square's west side, and there is a fountain in the middle.

Centre for Culture

Every city has a place for meetings and concerts, but not always in an old monastery. Such architecture inspires. That explains the success of the oldest Lublin festivals that the Centre for Culture organizes. Even on ordinary days the place is full of young and old enjoying art exhibitions or heading to the Centralna Café, probably the most avant-garde club space in the city. The Centre is open till late, which gives you a chance to enter and wander the corridors in search of neon signs that tell the story of Lublin.

Centre for the Meeting of Cultures

The largest cultural institution on this side of the Vistula River. Here stars such as Bobby McFerrin (Don't Worry Be Happy!) and CocoRosie performed. Terraces with the Municipal Artistic Apiary are worth visiting, not to mention galleries and a theater. If by any chance, you haven't seen the original 'Union of Lublin' painting at the Castle, you will find backlit reproduction here.

State Museum at Majdanek

'Let our fate be a warning to you' is inscribed on the dome of the Mausoleum. The German Nazi concentration camp operated from 1941 to 1944. The Red Army put an end to it (although the NKVD used part of it as political prison). In November 1944, the first museum of the Holocaust and other horrors of World War II was formed here. Till now, it preserves the memory of both perpetrators and the victims.

The Open Air Village Museum

The museum is situated in the river valley. A wooden church from the 17th century stands next to thatched cottages, where geese and goats reign. Also, the whole borderland town – a shtetl, hides among the limes and birches and lilacs bushes. The houses are full of gems, from folk paintings to wooden tools. Also, outdoor events are organised, such as dance parties and Midsummer Night.

Lublin Underground Route

The Underground Route was created by connecting numerous Old Town cellars. It runs under the Market Square, Złota and Archidiekańska Streets, and ends at Po Farze Square. During the tour, you can see the models of the city's historical evolution. There is also a mechanical theater that tells the story of Lublin's miraculous rescue from fire in the 18th century.

Archcathedral of St. John the Baptist

The former Jesuit temple now is the seat of the Catholic bishop. The Jesuits had an idea of driving people to God by the power of imagination, as you can see in polychromes by Joseph Meyer. Their greens and pinks harmonise with the gold and black of the main altar. It appears to be even higher than 25 metres and has a tabernacle in the shape of the Lateran Basilica. But the surprise awaits in the sacristy. Being there, stand in the corner and try to whisper!

Chachmei Lublin Yeshiva

The Lublin School of the Sages was one of the largest Talmudic centres in the world. In pre-war Lublin, it was among the first institutions of higher education. Years of nazi occupation saw the destruction of its library and the famous model of the Jerusalem temple. After the war, the place hosted Medical Academy. Today Yeshiva houses a synagogue and a museum, as well as the Ilan Hotel and a restaurant.

Old Jewish Cemetery

The place was established in the 16th century. Following tradition, it was located on a hill. During the German occupation, the Nazis desecrated its graves and, from the stones, made a terrace for the infamous Lublin oppressor, Odilo Globocnik, and a road in Majdanek. Only about 60 matzevots survived, one of which marks the burial place of Yaakov Yitzhak haLevi Horowitz, the Seer of Lublin.

Trynitarzka Tower

The museum has been arranged in the Trynitarzka Tower from the 17th century. It is the highest viewing point in the Old Town. To climb to its top and admire the panorama of Lublin, one has to climb 207 stairs. The museum houses a collection of religious objects, including sculptures, icons and liturgical clothes.

Saxon Garden

Zamoyski Museum in Kozłówka

The late baroque seat of the Bielinski and Zamoyski families is full of paintings and precious furniture. It all tempts one to take a photo and post it with "that's my hotel!" text. There is also a chapel next to the palace on the model of the royal oratory at Versailles. Polish and European traditions fuse in this well-preserved complex. In contrast to aristocratic splendour, the museum also houses the Socialist Realist Art Gallery.

Krakowska Gate & Museum of the History of the City of Lublin

The gate that leads to the Old Town is one of the Lublin symbols. Once, it was the city's main entrance. Today, it is the seat of the Museum of its history. The Main Building of The Catholic University of Lublin

It was a monastery, later turned into barracks. After the rebirth of Poland in 1918, father Idzi Radziszewski organized the university there. During World War II, Nazis shot dozens of its academics. Their aim? To destroy the Polish culture. Later, here was the only Catholic university in the Eastern Block. Now, days are brighter. Being in Lublin in spring, go to the courtyard, sit on a bench next to the papal monument and admire blooming magnolias. That can be your first step in theology!

Graveyards by the Lipowa Street

The necropolis consist of four parts: Catholic, Protestant, Orthodox, and military. Prominent Lublinians, such as linguist Hieronim Łopaciński and poet Józef Czechowicz are buried here. There are also graves of the Castle prisoners, insurgents from 1863 and Soviet soldiers who fought for Lublin in 1944. Among trees, for sure you will spot the Orthodox Church of the Myrrhbearers. The Graveyard is a perfect place for a peaceful stroll. During the summer, oriole sings among oaks, and autumn evenings are full of owls' cries.

Labirynt Gallery

This cultural institution was established in 1956. Its seed was the Biuro Wystaw Artystycznych (Office of Artistic Exhibitions). Today it focuses mainly on contemporary art and performance. Classics sit side by side with debutants. It is the Labyrinth Gallery that helps one to find a place in Lublin and grasp what connects this city to the world.

Festivals & Events

Lublin's festivals set the whole city ablaze. The fires are put by artists from all over the world. Every year, they fill the city with music. Its squares are full of sculptures that sometimes refuse to stand on a pedestal and dance in the streets of the Old Town. During a festival, there is not such a thing as an ordinary walk. It is time of inspiration! Especially, when the fire-swallower meets the fire-breather in the Po Farze Square. Such a meeting is possible during Europe's unrivalled new circus festival - Carnaval Sztukmistrzów. Another event is the East of Culture - Other Sounds Art'n'Music Festival. It is a series of concerts of alternative music. Also, other events, such as the re:tradycja or the Jewish Culture Festival, fill the Lublin with laughter and light. If you want to breathe this air, plan your arrival in the summer, because that is when the biggest celebrations take place, and the weather favours staying outdoor until late. But be careful, Lublin's festivals steal hearts!

Lublin multicultural

The long history of the city located on the trade route is associated with multiculturalism. Over the years, **Orthodox, Jewish and Greek Catholic** traders and craftsmen settled here. During the Reformation, religious tolerance allowed the development of Protestant communities. Western industrialists, who came to Lublin in the 19th century, took part in the creating landscape of the city and the society. Following the multicultural route of Lublin, you will find not only architectural gems but also interesting stories and characters that shaped the city.

Jagiellonian Lublin

The period in the history of Poland ruled by the Jagiellonian dynasty is called the Golden Age. For a good reason! **Lublin became a strong merchant city and a multicultural centre** at that time. Numerous privileges allowed the inhabitants to get rich, expand the city, organise schools and public institutions. But as we all know, money does not bring happiness! Jagiellonian period is also significant for art and music. The splendour of Lublin in the 15th and 16th centuries is remembered by numerous monuments and the **Jagiellonian Fair** - a festival of traditions and crafts, which takes place every August.



Night of Culture

Night of Culture is a festival of light installations and shows in the city. The programme consists of hundreds of events, most of which move away from concert halls, art galleries and museums into gates, squares and streets of the Old Town. Art revives unknown and forgotten places, while familiar places appear in a completely new, unusual light. Night of Culture is a festival of endless surprises.

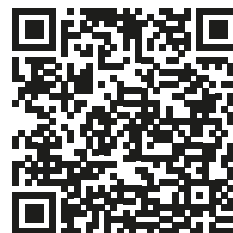

Monument of History

More than 700 years of Lublin past times have abounded in events. Architectural endeavours and fires, wars and fairs shaped the city. Now, its heritage is the key to understand the culture of Poland. How to even measure the historical, scientific and artistic value of places such as The Holy Trinity Chapel? The oldest part of Lublin simply deserved the status of Monument of History, and the city is among 10 Polish cities that have received this status.

The Monument of History includes Castle Hill, the Old Town and part of the city centre. Those sections of the city are full of buildings raised thru centuries, from the Middle Ages to modernity. Together, they create a captivating landscape that stretches over the hills and valleys.

The Historical Architectural and Urban Complex of Lublin consists of:

- The Castle Hill and the Lublin Castle,
- The Old Town with the Crown Tribunal and Basilica of St. Stanislaus,
- The old Polish part of Krakowskie Przedmieście with tenement houses and the Church of the Holy Spirit,
- Litewski Square,
- The former monastery of St. Bridget with the Church of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary the Victorious,
- The former Bernardine monastery and the Church of the Conversion of St. Paul,
- Lublin Cathedral and southern buildings at Królewska street.

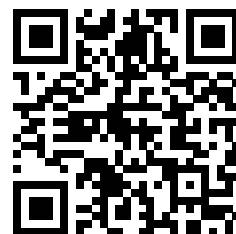

The resulting concoction of inspiration doesn't let anyone beat its taste, just as Lublin restaurateurs do not let themselves be outdone in hospitality. Here, taking care of guests' taste buds is a matter of honour. But don't worry! There will be no duels, at least not with swords or sabres, at most with forszmak, dumplings or onionularz. I mean, cebularz! Or, as Lubliners used to say - pletzl. So many cultures, so many ingredients in one City of Inspiration for you to try!

Lublin cuisine

The regional cuisine of Lublin is a specific blend of Polish, Eastern European and Jewish dishes. Here you can find popular specialities, like **pierogi** (dumplings), **żurek w chlebie** (sour soup served in a loaf of bread) and a local delicacy - **cebularz** (onion flatbread). You can also look for street, vegan and Italian food in Lublin. Breweries offer craft beers, ciders and mead. Lublin's restaurants and bars create a unique atmosphere of eastern European slow life. Regardless of the season, it is well worth going in. In winter, they invite you to warm interiors for a mulled beer, and in summer, they delight you with lively gardens.

Lublin specialities

Cebularz is probably known to every self-respecting resident of Lublin. This wheat pancake, 15 to 20 centimetres in diameter, covered with diced onions mixed with poppy seeds, is a delicacy of the Lublin region. Passed down from generation to generation, the recipe dates back to the 19th century. In 2007, cebularz was added to the list of traditional products, and since August 2014 it has been protected by European Union law as a regional product. Eating cebularz is a must-do point of a visit to Lublin.

Forszmak - for this warming dish, it is worth going to a regional restaurant. A thick stew based on various types of meat with the addition of pickled cucumbers, peppers, tomatoes and onions, it is very filling and recommended especially in autumn and winter.

Schabowy po lubelsku. Its secret lies in the coating, which differs from the standard one. It is breaded without the addition of breadcrumbs and, thanks to a large amount of egg, may look like an omelette. The quality of the products, which is the domain of regional cuisine, is crucial.

Pierogi ruskie, with mushrooms, meat and fruit are known all over Poland. In Lublin, you can taste another type of pierogi - **pierogi po lubelsku**. The stuffing of this regional delicacy consists of buckwheat groats, cottage cheese, onions, smoked pork fat or bacon. One thing is certain, they are worth trying.

Spirits of the highest quality are produced in the Lublin region, which is famous for its hops and apple orchards. Local breweries and ciders are a showpiece of the region and a brand recognised all over Poland. They are worth tasting in local pubs and restaurants. There you can also find meads or liqueurs, which are popular in the winter months.

Have you heard about cebularz? Its original name was pletzl. Here, you can meet pletzl friends! Such as chulent or roast goose with apples or other Jewish specialties. The secret is the pre-war recipes, sometimes directly from the Mandragora owner's grandmother. And, especially Fridays and Saturdays, there is a rare spice in use – klezmer music!

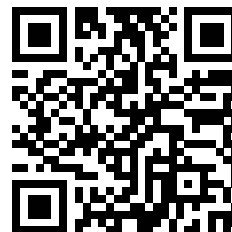
