★ Fez - Al Quaraouiyine University

Established in 859, a century prior to the University of Al Azhar in Egypt, two centuries before Oxford in the United Kingdom, and four centuries before the Sorbonne in France, Al Quaraouiyine holds the distinction of being the oldest continuously operating university globally, recognized by UNESCO and the Guinness Book of Records.



THE PLEASURES OF MOROCCAN CUISINE



★ GASTRONOMIC TRIPS

★ Moroccan Starters

Typically served at the beginning of meals, vary across regions but commonly include salads of raw or cooked vegetables, Briouates stuffed with chicken or minced meat, a ratatouille of peppers and tomatoes known as Tektouta, and the renowned Zaâlouk, an eggplant puree. Each dish, seasoned uniquely, adds its distinct flavor and color to the table.



★ The Méchoui

This traditional dish, influenced by Turkish cuisine, involves slow-cooking lamb or beef in a clay oven, preserving its authentic flavors and tenderness.



★ Pastry - Gazelle Horns

When discussing Moroccan pastries, it's impossible not to mention the renowned "gazelle horns" cakes. These delectable treats are crafted from ground almonds enveloped in a delicate pastry infused with the fragrance of orange blossom. They pair exquisitely with refreshing mint green tea.



★ The Tagine

Morocco's most ubiquitous dish, prepared with a unique cooking technique and available in various versions, continually delights even the most discerning palates. Featuring ingredients like fish, chicken, meat, vegetables, and occasionally nuts, prunes, and apricots, this dish is slow-cooked with a blend of essential spices for added flavor.



★ Couscous

Couscous, originating from the Amazigh culture, holds a special place in Moroccan cuisine. A staple found in every household and restaurant, it is a beloved dish often enjoyed on Fridays. Served in various styles, from vegetarian to meat, fish, chicken, and even sweet varieties, couscous is typically complemented by a flavorful vegetable broth known as "marqa".





★ GOLFING
